Writing on River Rocks, A Do It yourself idea for weddings

Perfect for a nature wedding. Rocks as place cards that later can become paperweights as a memento of the wedding.

MATERIALS:

-River rocks or decorative polished beach pebbles purchased from the gardening section of a home improvement store.

-Pen-touch Calligrapher pens (2 sizes, 5 colors; Black, White, Gold, Silver, Copper)

-Pen-touch pens (3 point sizes, 5 colors plus Black, White, Gold, Silver Copper)

-napkin working cradle

-graphite pencil and eraser

-tracing paper

Rock place cards: Names, Initials, Words of Inspiration.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Organization of the pens and how to make a Pen-touch value chart on the rocks. Select any rock and know which pen color will work.

TECHNIQUE:

-Make a napkin working cradle or "nest" to hold the rock in place.

-Write with the Pen-touch Calligrapher and also use the corner of the nib to write.

-Compare rock place card to rock value chart for selection of Pen-touch pen.

-Write directly on the rock with a pencil first or can write on tracing paper using it as a guide to consider lettering placement making sure the name will fit on the rock. The adjustments can be made on the tracing paper.

-Write with Pen-touch Calligraphy pens.

-Enhance, outline, highlight, embellish. Clean up edges with smaller pens.
