



FOILED EYE THREE WAYS

INSTRUCTIONS

SUPPLIES

- Paper
- Marker or Pen
- ScanNCut
- ScanNCut Scanning Mat
- Cardstock
- 4x4 Card (4x8 patterned paper folded in half)
- Therm O Web Deco Foil Hot Melt Adhesive
- ScanNCut Middle Tack Mat
- Laminator
- Therm O Web Deco Foil
- Favorite Adhesive
- Cotton Fabric
- Pillow Cover
- ScanNCut Standard Mat with High Tack Fabric Support Sheet
- Optional: Terial Magic
- Iron & Ironing Board
- Therm O Web Deco Foil Toner Sheets
- Canvas
- Acrylic Paint & Paintbrush
- Foam Adhesive
- Scissors

1. Draw a design on a piece of paper.
2. Scan the design into the ScanNCut, using the Scan to Cut Data function.
3. Save the design into the ScanNCut.

- Be sure to mirror your design and follow the instructions on the package for cutting.
- I have found the Hot Melt Adhesive cuts best using a fresh Standard blade with a blade depth setting of 2.5, pressure of 4, and speed of 1. But, you should do a Test Cut with your machine.

3. Place the eye iris onto the white of the eye and the word hello onto the card base.

4. Sandwich these pieces into a piece of parchment paper (included in the Hot Melt Adhesive packaging) and run them through a laminator.

- Follow the instructions on the Hot Melt Adhesive for laminator settings.

5. Once the pieces have cooled, remove the backing paper.

6. Place foil over the now adhesive and sandwich the foil and pieces into a piece of parchment paper and run them through a laminator.
- Again, follow the instructions on the Hot Melt Adhesive



For the Card:

1. Use the ScanNCut to cut all of the pieces except for the eye iris and the word hello from cardstock.
2. Cut the eye iris and the word hello from Deco Foil Hot Melt Adhesive.

packaging for laminator settings.

- Be sure to place the foil colored side up.
7. Once the pieces have cooled, remove the excess foil.
 8. Assemble the card using your favorite paper adhesive.

For the Pillow Cover:

1. Same steps as for the card, but using fabric instead of cardstock, an iron instead of a laminator, and fusible web instead of paper adhesive.
2. Be sure to follow the instructions on the Hot Melt Adhesive for fabric application.
- NOTE: If you remove the foil while it's still warm, you get the distressed look you see on the right, instead of the smooth look you see below.
3. When cutting fabric with your ScanNCut, be sure to use a High Tack Fabric Support sheet. I also like to use Terial Magic to stiffen my fabric

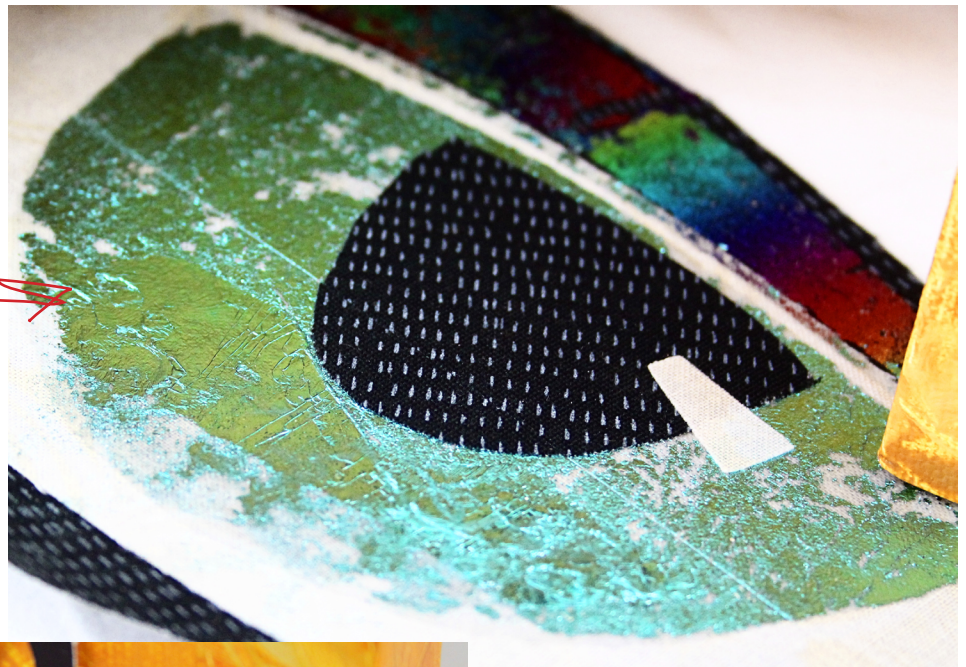
for cutting. Stiffer fabric is better for intricate cuts like the word "hello."

For the Canvas:

1. Paint a canvas with acrylic paint. Let dry.
2. Use the ScanNCut to cut all the pieces of your design from Therm O Web Deco Foil Toner Sheets.
- I have found that the Toner

Sheets cut well using a Standard Blade at a blade setting of 4, speed of 1 and pressure of 0. But, you should do a Test Cut with your machine.

3. Apply Deco Foil to the pieces you've cut using the instructions found on the Toner Sheets packaging.
- Essentially, sandwich the cut Toner Sheets and the Deco



Foil in a piece of parchment paper (included in the Toner Sheets package) and run through a laminator.

- Check the packaging for laminator settings.
4. Once the pieces have cooled, remove the excess foil.
 5. Assemble the eye by placing foam adhesive between each layer.
 6. Adhere the eye and sentiment to the painted canvas.
