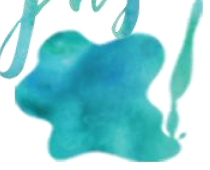

Powertex© Pendant

Materials

- Powertex© Medium
- Powertex© Half Faces
- 2 x cotton strips
- Scissors
- Plastic container
- ½" paintbrush
- Nonstick craft mat
- Plastic to cover work area
- Disposable gloves
- *optional jump rings and cording or pin back

Instructions

1. Cut fabric into strips approximately 1.5-2" wide x 12-16" long.
2. Pour the desired Powertex© into a plastic container in which you can work easily. Put on latex or vinyl gloves and dip a fabric strip into the Powertex, squeeze out excess, but don't wring or twist. When your strip has too much Powertex, take a second piece of cloth; wrap it around the first one to absorb the excess. Do not work too wet.
3. Drape fabric around half face with face flat on nonstick craft mat. Be sure to create interesting folds. *try not to touch face too much.
4. Use ½" paintbrush to paint Powertex© medium on face. Do not overwork or brush strokes will become visible. It is better to allow one coat to dry and then add another coat to fill in any places.
5. Allow to dry and then brush Powertex on back of piece also.
6. To create a Bronze effect, dip brush in varnish and then into Powertex© Bronze Gold. Mix and wipe off on cloth to dry brush on top. Try other pigment colors for different effects.
7. After piece is almost dry, use you can use paper piercer to poke hole in fabric in top. Add jump ring, bail and cording. Or you can glue pin back to back.
