## Powertex© Mixed Media Canvas

## **Materials**

- Powertex® Medium
  - lvory
  - Yellow Ochre
- Powertex© 3D Flex
- Powertex Bister
  - o Green
  - Mahogany
  - Yellow
- Photocopy (laser/toner) photo printed on tissue paper
- The Crafter's Workshop Matte Medium
- The Crafter's Workshop Stencil TCW712 Butterfly Trail
- Heat gun
- Plastic container
- Palette knife
- 2" & 1½" paintbrush
- Craft flowers
- Plastic to cover work area
- Disposable gloves



## Instructions

- 1. Use 2" paintbrush to paint ivory mixed with a little yellow ochre over most of canvas and sides. Don't overmix colors and remember to leave some open space. Allow to dry.
- 2. Spray repositionable adhesive to copy paper. Dry to tacky and place a piece of tissue paper on top. Run through printer to print photo of choice. Use laser printer, water-proof ink printer or toner copier. Regular inkjet will bleed with most ink jet printers. Allow to dry and carefully remove tissue paper from copy paper.

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3. Apply a thin coat matte medium to section of canvas for photo. Carefully apply printed tissue paper and apply thin coat over tissue paper. Don't worry if a few wrinkles and do not

overwork and tear tissue.

4. Pour a little Powertex© 3D Flex into a plastic container in which you can work easily. Put on latex or vinyl gloves and add Powertex Ivory. Mix to modeling paste consistency.

- 5. Place stencil on canvas. Using palette knife, apply modeling paste through stencil. Lift stencil and wash immediately. Powertex will dry onto stencil so clean in tub of water. \*\*Do not wash down sink. TIP wipe off as much as possible with baby wipe and then do a quick rinse. Allow modeling paste to dry on canvas.
- 6. Pour a little Powertex color on canvas and work around with palette knife making sure there are thin and thick areas. Leave a few open or very thin spots on canvas.
- 7. While Powertex is still wet, spray random areas with Bister, making sure to cover photo with paper towel or paper.
- 8. Using heat gun, apply heat to Bistered Powertex starting further away and getting closer as it heats. Cracks will start appearing. More heat, more cracks.
- 9. Dip flowers or other embellishments in Powertex and apply to canvas.
- 10. You can apply a little more Bister in places over cracks. Allow to dry and wipe some areas with wet sponge or baby wipe.
- 11. \*\*optional dry brush with pigment color or ivory Powertex to highlight textures.
- 12. Allow canvas to completely dry. You can protect with a light varnish after a few days.
