Happy Shacks with Jodi Ohl

Instructions

- Start by drawing your design using a Stabilo Graphite pencil, stick to simple shapes such as squares, rectangles, circles but be playful and add curves, squiggles, fun elements such as polka dots, flowers, etc.
- 2. Next, add touches of darker pencil marks with the stabilo pencil in black
- Once you are happy with your design, start activating those lines with your water brush pen to create a variety of values (shades of gray).
- 4. Let dry before building your base of colors
- 5. Next, start adding sepia tones with your quinacridone nickel azo gold, then start coloring in the design with a nice balance of color throughout your entire painting
- If you use a simple palette with no more than 3-4 colors and mix those colors with your neutral base, you will create a cohesive design
- Allow your paint to dry then add line work using the Faber Castell pens. Be loose with your line work, you want it to look 'sketch-like' rather than stilted.
- 8. To finish, use an archival matte spray varnish (optional). My varnish of choice is either Golden Matte Varnish or Winsor Newton.

- 6x6 Gessobord (Ampersand or Davinci Ultra Smooth)
- Assorted Golden High Flow Paint (I like to use titanium white, titan buff, shading gray, quinacridone nickel azo gold, and 2-3 additional pops of color such as teal, quin red, magenta
- Waterbrush pen
- Assorted Faber Castell Pitt Pens (XS, F, S)
- Stabilo Marks All Pencil (graphite and black)
