Modern Wood Mobile

Materials and Tools:

Wood shapes
Sakura® Permapaque™ Opaque Markers
Sakura® Pentouch™ Paint Markers
15mm jump rings
Stick or small branch
String
Proxxon® power tools
DAP® RapidFuse™ All purpose adhesive
Scissors
Pliers
Pencil

Optional: clear acrylic varnish

Instructions:

- 1. Arrange the wood shapes the way you would like them to connect together. Use a pencil to mark where you want the holes to connect. Use the Proxxon tool and a 1/16-inch tool bit to drill the holes.
- 2. Use the markers to doodle designs on each wood shape. Decorate both sides of the shapes if you would like to create a mobile (or one side only if you are creating a wall piece). Use the Permapaque markers to color in solid blocks; use the Pentouch markers for outlining or adding details on top of the Permapaques. (Optional: seal the wood shapes using clear acrylic varnish.) Glue wood shapes together to embellish the design as you choose.
- 3. Connect the wood shapes using jump rings by opening and closing the jump rings from side to side. You may also connect the wood shapes using string, depending on the type of look you desire.
- 4. To connect the wood shapes to the branch, wrap a piece of string around the branch and tie one end to one of the jump rings attached to the wood shapes. Repeat on the other end of the branch. Hang your mobile from a nail or string.
