Tabletop Plant Stand By Kristin Gambaccini

Supplies

- *Pine wood pieces 1" x 2" x 8" cut into (4) 10' pieces & (1) 14' piece
- *Reciprocating Saw
- *Wood Stain (Pine) & 2 rags
- *Sanding Block
- *Clear Acrylic Sealer
- *1 1/4" Screws
- *Power Drill & Phillips Insert Bit
- *Stained Tooling Leather piece approx. 6" x 12"
- *3/16 drill bit
- *3/16 leather punch
- *(3) 5x12mm leather rivets brass or bronze
- *(3) 1" bronze binder rings
- *Ruler & pencil
- *Sharp Scissors
- *Hot Glue Gun
- *Mini live Succulents & Terra Cotta Pots
- *Mini Macramé Plant Holders



Instructions

- 1. Measure, cut & stain wood pieces for stand. Spray dry pieces with clear acrylic sealer
- 2. Mark & drill start 1 1/4" hole 4" down on (2) leg pieces. Attach legs together using screws
- 3. Using a leather punch, fold (3) 5" leather strips in half & punch hole approx. 1/4" from edge
- 4. Attach (3) 5" leather strips folded in half to top rail with leather rivets by predrilling 3 holes (in 3" increments) across top rail piece &
- 5. Attach leg pieces to top rail piece approx. 1/2" from top of front leg pieces using
- 6. Measure & mark (1) 1" strip cut in half & (2) 3.5" strips on leather
- 7. Cut strips of leather for plant stand accents
- 8. Hot Glue leather pieces to stand at joints and bottom of legs
- 9. Hang plants & macramé

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
