

Frosted Botanicals

Supply list:

- Wooden Picture Frame with kick stand
- Dynasty Black Silver ¾ Flat Brush
- Acrylic paints (in video: Payne's grey and Titan Buff)
- Disposable Baking pan or any other container for marbling
- Marabu Easy Marble in assorted opaque and neutral colors (in video: Black, Grey, White, Grey Blue)
- Grafix Matte Film for Inkjet
- Marabu Alcohol Based Sketch Markers (12 ct Sugarholic Colors)
- Dynasty Black Silver #6 and #12 Flat Brushes
- Isopropyl Alcohol
- Scissors
- Fine black tip marker

Instructions:

Step 1: Paint a generous coating of acrylic to both sides of the wooden frame. Apply the two colors loosely to create variations of color. Allow to dry completely

Step 2: Fill a disposable baking pan with enough water to allow you to fully submerge your wooden frame.

Step 3: Shake your Marabu Easy Marble paints and open the lids before applying. Shake a generous amount of selected colors to the surface of the water. Remember that you have about a minute of working time.

Step 4: Fully submerge your wooden frame with a quick dip in and out of the pan. Allow to dry completely.

Step 5: Print vintage botanicals on the Grafix Matte Inkjet Film. Make sure that you print on the correct side.

Step 6: Flip the matte inkjet film over so that the printed side is face down. Use the sketch markers to loosely apply color to the shapes on the back side. Take your Dynasty Black Silver Brush and alcohol to manipulate and dilute the color creating watercolor like effects. Allow to dry completely.

Step 7: Use cardboard cutout or the opening of the wooden frame to trace an outline of the image using the black tip marker and cut it out to insert into the frame. Clamp it in the back to secure into the frame.
